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Section I. Invitation to Bid



INVITATION TO BID FOR GENERAL PEST CONTROL AT CENTRAL NATIONAL MUSEUM BUILDINGS – FY 2022

- 1. The **NATIONAL MUSEUM OF THE PHILIPPINES**, through the General Appropriations Act FY 2022 intends to apply the sum of **One Million Four Hundred Four Thousand Pesos (Php 1,404,000.00)** being the ABC to payments under the project mentioned above. Bids received in excess of the ABC shall be automatically rejected at bid opening.
- 2. The NATIONAL MUSEUM OF THE PHILIPPINES now invites bids for the above Procurement Project. Delivery of the Goods and Services is required within Twelve (12) Months. Bidders should have completed, within five (5) years from the date of submission and receipt of bids, a contract similar to the Project. The description of an eligible bidder is contained in the Bidding Documents, particularly, in Section II (Instructions to Bidders).
- 3. Bidding will be conducted through open competitive bidding procedures using a non-discretionary "*pass/fail*" criterion as specified in 2016 revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act (RA) No. 9184.

Bidding is restricted to Filipino citizens/sole proprietorships, partnerships, or organizations with at least sixty percent (60%) interest or outstanding capital stock belonging to citizens of the Philippines, and to citizens or organizations of a country the laws or regulations of which grant similar rights or privileges to Filipino citizens, pursuant to RA No. 5183.

- 4. Prospective Bidders may obtain further information from the **NATIONAL MUSEUM OF THE PHILIPPINES BIDS AND AWARDS COMMITTEE** and inspect the Bidding Documents at the address given below from **Monday** – **Friday at 9:30 A.M.- 2:30 P.M.**
- 5. A complete set of Bidding Documents may be acquired by interested Bidders on 21 February 2022 from the given address below and upon payment of the applicable fee for the Bidding Documents, pursuant to the latest Guidelines issued by the GPPB, in the amount of One Thousand Pesos (Php 1,000.00) The Procuring Entity shall allow the bidder to present its proof of payment for the fees in person, or through electronic means.

- 6. The **NATIONAL MUSEUM OF THE PHILIPPINES** will hold a Pre-Bid Conference on **28 February 2022**, **9:30 A.M.** at **Old Civil Service Building**, **National Museum of the Philippines**, **Padre Burgos Street**, **Manila** which shall be open to prospective bidders.
- 7. Bids must be duly received by the BAC Secretariat through manual submission at the office address indicated below. LATE BIDS SHALL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
- 8. All Bids must be accompanied by a bid security in any of the acceptable forms and in the amount stated in **ITB** Clause 14.
- 9. Bid opening shall be on 14 March 2022, 9:30 A.M. at Old Civil Service Building, National Museum of the Philippines, Padre Burgos Street, Manila. Bids will be opened in the presence of the bidders' representatives who choose to attend the activity.
- 10. The **NATIONAL MUSEUM OF THE PHILIPPINES** reserves the right to reject any and all bids, declare a failure of bidding, or not award the contract at any time prior to contract award in accordance with Sections 35.6 and 41 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected bidder or bidders.

Section II. Instructions to Bidders

1. Scope of Bid

The Procuring Entity, *National Museum of the Philippines* wishes to receive Bids for the **General Pest Control at Central National Museum Buildings – FY 2022**, with identification number *NMPBAC-PB-2022-2-01*.

The Procurement Project (referred to herein as "Project") is composed of one (1) lot, the details of which are described in Section VII (Technical Specifications).

2. Funding Information

- 2.1. The GOP through the source of funding as indicated below for *FY 2022* in the amount of **One Million Four Hundred Four Thousand Pesos (Php 1,404,000.00)**
- 2.2. The source of funding is: NGA, the General Appropriations Act

3. Bidding Requirements

The Bidding for the Project shall be governed by all the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including its Generic Procurement Manuals and associated policies, rules and regulations as the primary source thereof, while the herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source thereof.

Any amendments made to the IRR and other GPPB issuances shall be applicable only to the ongoing posting, advertisement, or **IB** by the BAC through the issuance of a supplemental or bid bulletin.

The Bidder, by the act of submitting its Bid, shall be deemed to have verified and accepted the general requirements of this Project, including other factors that may affect the cost, duration and execution or implementation of the contract, project, or work and examine all instructions, forms, terms, and project requirements in the Bidding Documents.

4. Corrupt, Fraudulent, Collusive, and Coercive Practices

The Procuring Entity, as well as the Bidders and Suppliers, shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of the contract. They or through an agent shall not engage in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, and obstructive practices defined under Annex "I" of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 or other integrity violations in competing for the Project.

5. Eligible Bidders

- 5.1. Only Bids of Bidders found to be legally, technically, and financially capable will be evaluated.
- 5.2. Foreign ownership exceeding those allowed under the rules may participate pursuant to:

- i. When a Treaty or International or Executive Agreement as provided in Section 4 of the RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR allow foreign bidders to participate;
- ii. Citizens, corporations, or associations of a country, included in the list issued by the GPPB, the laws or regulations of which grant reciprocal rights or privileges to citizens, corporations, or associations of the Philippines;
- *iii.* When the Goods sought to be procured are not available from local suppliers; or
- *iv.* When there is a need to prevent situations that defeat competition or restrain trade.
- 5.3. Pursuant to Section 23.4.1.3 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No.9184, the Bidder shall have an SLCC that is at least one (1) contract similar to the Project the value of which, adjusted to current prices using the PSA's CPI, must be at least equivalent to:

For the procurement of Non-expendable Supplies and Services: The Bidder must have completed a single contract that is similar to this Project, equivalent to at least fifty percent (50%) of the ABC.

5.4. The Bidders shall comply with the eligibility criteria under Section 23.4.1 of the 2016 IRR of RA No. 9184.

6. Origin of Goods

There is no restriction on the origin of goods other than those prohibited by a decision of the UN Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the UN, subject to Domestic Preference requirements under **ITB** Clause 18.

7. Subcontracts

7.1. The Bidder may subcontract portions of the Project to the extent allowed by the Procuring Entity as stated herein, but in no case more than twenty percent (20%) of the Project.

The Procuring Entity has prescribed that: Subcontracting is not allowed.

8. Pre-Bid Conference

The Procuring Entity will hold a pre-bid conference for this Project on the specified date and time and either at its physical address as indicated in paragraph 6 of the **IB**.

9. Clarification and Amendment of Bidding Documents

Prospective bidders may request for clarification on and/or interpretation of any part of the Bidding Documents. Such requests must be in writing and received by the

Procuring Entity, either at its given address or through electronic mail indicated in the **IB**, at least ten (10) calendar days before the deadline set for the submission and receipt of Bids.

10. Documents comprising the Bid: Eligibility and Technical Components

- 10.1. The first envelope shall contain the eligibility and technical documents of the Bid as specified in Section VIII (Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents).
- 10.2. The Bidder's SLCC as indicated in **ITB** Clause 5.3 should have been completed within *the period as provided in paragraph 2 of the IB* prior to the deadline for the submission and receipt of bids.
- 10.3. If the eligibility requirements or statements, the bids, and all other documents for submission to the BAC are in foreign language other than English, it must be accompanied by a translation in English, which shall be authenticated by the appropriate Philippine foreign service establishment, post, or the equivalent office having jurisdiction over the foreign bidder's affairs in the Philippines. Similar to the required authentication above, for Contracting Parties to the Apostille Convention, only the translated documents shall be authenticated through an apostille pursuant to GPPB Resolution No. 13-2019 dated 23 May 2019. The English translation shall govern, for purposes of interpretation of the bid.

11. Documents comprising the Bid: Financial Component

- 11.1. The second bid envelope shall contain the financial documents for the Bid as specified in **Section VIII (Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents)**.
- 11.2. If the Bidder claims preference as a Domestic Bidder or Domestic Entity, a certification issued by DTI shall be provided by the Bidder in accordance with Section 43.1.3 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 11.3. Any bid exceeding the ABC indicated in paragraph 1 of the **IB** shall not be accepted.

12. Bid Prices

- 12.1. Prices indicated on the Price Schedule shall be entered separately in the following manner:
 - a. For Goods offered from within the Procuring Entity's country:
 - i. The price of the Goods quoted EXW (ex-works, ex-factory, exwarehouse, ex-showroom, or off-the-shelf, as applicable);
 - ii. The cost of all customs duties and sales and other taxes already paid or payable;

- iii. The cost of transportation, insurance, and other costs incidental to delivery of the Goods to their final destination; and
- iv. The price of other (incidental) services, if any, listed in e.

13. Bid and Payment Currencies

- 13.1. For Goods that the Bidder will supply from outside the Philippines, the bid prices may be quoted in the local currency or tradeable currency accepted by the BSP at the discretion of the Bidder. However, for purposes of bid evaluation, Bids denominated in foreign currencies, shall be converted to Philippine currency based on the exchange rate as published in the BSP reference rate bulletin on the day of the bid opening.
- 13.2. Payment of the contract price shall be made in: *Philippine Pesos*.

14. Bid Security

- 14.1. The Bidder shall submit a Bid Securing Declaration¹ or any form of Bid Security in the amount indicated in the **BDS**, which shall be not less than the percentage of the ABC in accordance with the schedule in the **BDS**.
- 14.2. The Bid and bid security shall be valid until **One Hundred Twenty (120)** calendar days. Any Bid not accompanied by an acceptable bid security shall be rejected by the Procuring Entity as non-responsive.

15. Sealing and Marking of Bids

Each Bidder shall submit one copy of the first and second components of its Bid.

The Procuring Entity may request additional hard copies and/or electronic copies of the Bid. However, failure of the Bidders to comply with the said request shall not be a ground for disqualification.

16. Deadline for Submission of Bids

16.1. The Bidders shall submit on the specified date and time and either at its physical address or through online submission as indicated in paragraph 7 of the **IB**.

17. Opening and Preliminary Examination of Bids

17.1. The BAC shall open the Bids in public at the time, on the date, and at the place specified in paragraph 9 of the **IB**. The Bidders' representatives who are present shall sign a register evidencing their attendance. In case videoconferencing, webcasting or other similar technologies will be used, attendance of participants shall likewise be recorded by the BAC Secretariat.

In case the Bids cannot be opened as scheduled due to justifiable reasons, the rescheduling requirements under Section 29 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall prevail.

17.2. The preliminary examination of bids shall be governed by Section 30 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

18. Domestic Preference

18.1. The Procuring Entity will grant a margin of preference for the purpose of comparison of Bids in accordance with Section 43.1.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

19. Detailed Evaluation and Comparison of Bids

- 19.1. The Procuring BAC shall immediately conduct a detailed evaluation of all Bids rated "*passed*," using non-discretionary pass/fail criteria. The BAC shall consider the conditions in the evaluation of Bids under Section 32.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 19.2. If the project allows partial bids, bidders may submit a proposal on any of the lots or items, and evaluation will be undertaken on a per lot or item basis, as the case maybe. In case, the Bid security as required by ITB Clause 15 shall be submitted for each lot or item separately.
- 19.3 The descriptions of the lots or items shall be indicated in Section VII (Technical Specifications), although the ABCs of these lots or items are indicated in the BDS for purposes of the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.2.6 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184. The NFCC must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder.
- 19.4 The Project shall be awarded as follows: One Project having several items that shall be awarded as one contract.
- 19.5 Except for bidders submitting a committed Line of Credit from a Universal or Commercial Bank in lieu of its NFCC computation, all Bids must include the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.1.4 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184, which must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder. For bidders submitting the committed Line of Credit, it must be at least equal to ten percent (10%) of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder.

20. Post-Qualification

20.2. Within a non-extendible period of five (5) calendar days from receipt by the Bidder of the notice from the BAC that it submitted the Lowest Calculated Bid, or in the case of multi-year Framework Agreement, that it is one of the eligible bidders who have submitted bids that are found to be technically and financially compliant, the Bidder shall submit its latest income and business tax returns filed and paid through the BIR Electronic Filing and Payment System (eFPS) and other appropriate licenses and permits required by law and stated in the

BDS. For every mini-competition in Framework Agreement, the LCB shall likewise submit the required documents for final Post Qualification.}

21. Signing of the Contract

21.1. The documents required in Section 37.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall form part of the Contract. Additional Contract documents are indicated in the **BDS**.

Section IV. General Conditions of Contract

1. Scope of Contract

This Contract shall include all such items, although not specifically mentioned, that can be reasonably inferred as being required for its completion as if such items were expressly mentioned herein. All the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including the Generic Procurement Manual, and associated issuances, constitute the primary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract, and thus, applicable in contract implementation. Herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract.

This is without prejudice to Sections 74.1 and 74.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 allowing the GPPB to amend the IRR, which shall be applied to all procurement activities, the advertisement, posting, or invitation of which were issued after the effectivity of the said amendment.

Additional requirements for the completion of this Contract shall be provided in the **Special Conditions of Contract (SCC).**

2. Advance Payment and Terms of Payment

- 2.1. Advance payment of the contract amount is provided under Annex "D" of the revised 2016 IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 2.2. The Procuring Entity is allowed to determine the terms of payment on the partial or staggered delivery of the Goods procured, provided such partial payment shall correspond to the value of the goods delivered and accepted in accordance with prevailing accounting and auditing rules and regulations. The terms of payment are indicated in the **SCC**.

3. Performance Security

Within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the Notice of Award by the Bidder from the Procuring Entity but in no case later than prior to the signing of the Contract by both parties, the successful Bidder shall furnish the performance security in any of the forms prescribed in Section 39 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

4. Inspection and Tests

The Procuring Entity or its representative shall have the right to inspect and/or to test the Goods to confirm their conformity to the Project specifications at no extra cost to the Procuring Entity in accordance with the Generic Procurement Manual. In addition to tests in the **SCC**, **Section IV** (**Technical Specifications**) shall specify what inspections and/or tests the Procuring Entity requires, and where they are to be conducted. The Procuring Entity shall notify the Supplier in writing, in a timely manner, of the identity of any representatives retained for these purposes.

All reasonable facilities and assistance for the inspection and testing of Goods, including access to drawings and production data, shall be provided by the Supplier to the authorized inspectors at no charge to the Procuring Entity.

5. Warranty

- 6.1. In order to assure that manufacturing defects shall be corrected by the Supplier, a warranty shall be required from the Supplier as provided under Section 62.1 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 6.2. The Procuring Entity shall promptly notify the Supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty. Upon receipt of such notice, the Supplier shall, repair or replace the defective Goods or parts thereof without cost to the Procuring Entity, pursuant to the Generic Procurement Manual.

6. Liability of the Supplier

The Supplier's liability under this Contract shall be as provided by the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.

If the Supplier is a joint venture, all partners to the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable to the Procuring Entity.

Section V. Special Conditions of Contract

Special Conditions of Contract

Packaging -

The Supplier shall provide such packaging of the Goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in this Contract. The packaging shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packaging case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the Goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.

The packaging, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the Contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified below, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the Procuring Entity.

The outer packaging must be clearly marked on at least four (4) sides as follows:

Name of the Supplier

Contract Description

Final Destination

Gross Weight

Any special lifting instructions

Any special handling instructions

Any relevant HAZCHEM classifications

A packaging list identifying the contents and quantities of the package is to be placed on an accessible point of the outer packaging if practical. If not practical the packaging list is to be placed inside the outer packaging but outside the secondary packaging.

Transportation –

Where the Supplier is required under Contract to deliver the Goods CIF, CIP, or DDP, transport of the Goods to the port of destination or such other named place of destination in the Philippines, as shall be specified in this Contract, shall be arranged and paid for by the Supplier, and the cost thereof shall be included in the Contract Price.

Where the Supplier is required under this Contract to transport the Goods to a specified place of destination within the Philippines, defined as the Project Site, transport to such place of destination in the Philippines, including insurance and

	storage, as shall be specified in this Contract, shall be arranged by the Supplier, and related costs shall be included in the contract price.
	Where the Supplier is required under Contract to deliver the Goods CIF, CIP or DDP, Goods are to be transported on carriers of Philippine registry. In the event that no carrier of Philippine registry is available, Goods may be shipped by a carrier which is not of Philippine registry provided that the Supplier obtains and presents to the Procuring Entity certification to this effect from the nearest Philippine consulate to the port of dispatch. In the event that carriers of Philippine registry are available but their schedule delays the Supplier in its performance of this Contract the period from when the Goods were first ready for shipment and the actual date of shipment the period of delay will be considered force majeure.
	The Procuring Entity accepts no liability for the damage of Goods during transit other than those prescribed by INCOTERMS for DDP deliveries. In the case of Goods supplied from within the Philippines or supplied by domestic Suppliers risk and title will not be deemed to have passed to the Procuring Entity until their receipt and final acceptance at the final destination.



TERMS OF REFERENCE TERMS OF REFERENCE

"General Pest Control at Central National Museum Buildings -FY 2022"

I. BACKGROUND

The National Museum Complex is composed of the National Museum of Fine Arts (NMFA), National Museum of Anthropology (NMA), National Museum of Natural History (NMNH) and Binhi ng Kalayaan and Orchidarium. These buildings experience presence/infestation of pests such as termites, rodents, crawling and flying insects, and stray cats. The service provider will designate their personnel to set traps and treatment against these pests and dispose the captured pests properly.

II. OBJECTIVE

To protect the National Museum collections, specimens, offices, records, equipment, employees and viewers from damages caused by general pests.

III. RESPONSIBILITIES

- 8. The Contractor shall ensure that service technicians to be assigned at the National Museum of the Philippines (NMP) Buildings are well screened, technically and professionally trained, courteous, cooperative, efficient, reliable, trustworthy, wellgroomed, physically and mentally fit. No personnel shall be assigned who has not been approved by the Facilities Management Division (FMD).
- 9. The Contractor and its service technicians shall agree to abide by the safety and security requirements of the NMP. They must comply with the NMP's House Rules and Regulations, directives, instructions and other existing rules and regulations while inside the premises.
- 10. The Contractor's service technicians shall subject themselves to security checks, but not limited to examination of the person and/or his/her personal belongings.
- 11. The Contractor shall ensure that its service technicians wear their proper company working uniform equipped with appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and identification cards while performing service maintenance and repair works inside the NMP's premises. Loitering inside the NMP's premises is not allowed.
- 12. The Contractor shall provide/equip all its service technicians with the tools during the course of the contract without any additional cost to the NMP.
- 13. The Contractor shall see to it that the area is clean and in its original condition after the servicing has been made. Any damage/s caused by the Contractor's assigned technician or personnel shall be restored by the Contractor at no additional cost to the NMP.
- 14. All other items of work not specifically mentioned but are necessary to complete the works shall be provided by the Contractor at no additional cost to the NMP.

- c. Cleaning and maintenance of bait stations
- d. Replenishment of baits

D. FELINE (CAT) CONTROL

a. Installation of traps (capturing methods to be used shall conform with RA8485: THE ANIMAL WELFARE ACT OF 1998)

b. Regular monitoring of installed traps

c. Coordination with the City Pound/Shelter to get the cats in behalf of National Museum

E. TERMITE CONTROL

1 Termite Control Treatment Inside the Building

a. Conduct thorough termite inspection inside the buildings to identify areas with active termite infestation.

b. Installation of the Above Ground Stations (AGS) with termite attractant to the areas with active termite infestation.

c. Termite bait will be placed in stations with positive termite activities until termites are completely eliminated.

d. Regular inspection and monitoring of the AGS to address and check existence of the termite colony until the termite colony has been eliminated.

e. Transfer of the AGS from the area wherein the termite colony has been eliminated to the new areas with active termite infestation.

2 Termite Control Treatment in Open Grounds, Lawn Areas & Landscape Areas

a. Soil Treatment around the building as close as possible to the base of the outside wall either by drilling, injection or cordoning method. Certified safe liquid termiticide will be applied to it by which the holes will be sealed with treated soil.

b. Monthly inspection/monitoring and servicing of all the open grounds/ lawn areas and landscaped areas to monitor new termite activities, if any.

c. Spot treatment shall be rendered if termite infestation is found in the open grounds/ lawn areas/ landscaped areas/ around the trees.

d. Demolition and treatment of termite mounds, if any, within the National Museum perimeter and application of anti-termite solutions to eliminate termite infestations.

The National Museum shall have the right, by written notice, to require replacement of any personnel assigned to perform the services. Replacement shall be required upon verification by the National Museum that the personnel violated provision/s of the contract or performed unsatisfactorily. The Contractor however, shall abide the procedural and substantial requirements of the Labor Code of the Philippines regarding termination of workers/employees.

IX. APPROVED BUDGET FOR CONTRACT

One Million Four Hundred Four Thousand Pesos (Php 1,404,000.00), Inclusive of all applicable taxes.

X. CONTRACT DURATION/COMPLETION TIME

The contract shall be effective for **Twelve (12) months or until December 31, 2022** (whichever is earlier) reckoned from the date stated in the Notice to Proceed (NTP) to be issued by **FMD**.

XI. TERMS OF PAYMENT

The contract price shall be paid in **Monthly Billings**.

XII. CONTRACTOR'S ELIGIBILITY

The Contractor is required to submit at least One (1) similar contract/s awarded and completed from Y2017 up to present with an amount of at least Fifty Percent (50%) of the Approved Budget for the Contract (ABC).

The Contractor shall have at least Five (5) years' experience in general pest control. Also, they shall have a Department of Agriculture - Fertilizer and Pesticide Authority (FPA) License as Exterminator and Department of Labor and Employment - Certificate of Registration as Contractors/Subcontractors.

XIII. PRE-TERMINATION CLAUSE

The contract is effective on the date indicated in the NTP and shall remain in full force for One (1) year or until terminated by either party (National Museum or Contractor) upon prior written notice by either party. Termination process shall follow the prescribed procedure under IRR-A R.A. 9184.

The National Museum reserves the right to pre-terminate the contract by serving written notice on the Contractor. If the Contractor does not appeal or seek reconsideration of the decision to pre-terminate within Fifteen (15) calendar days from receipt of the notice, the contract is deemed terminated. The grounds for the termination of the Contract by the National Museum include but not limited to the following:

- 3. Violation(s) of any of the terms and conditions of the Contract; and
- 4. Any other act or omission by the Contractor or its service technicians which is detrimental or prejudicial to the interest of the National Museum, its employee(s), or the public.

XIV. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

When the contractor fails to satisfactorily deliver goods/services under the contract within the specified delivery schedule, inclusive of duly granted time extensions, if any, the contractor shall be liable for damages for the delay and shall pay the procuring entity liquidated damages, not by way of penalty, an amount equal to 1/10 of 1% of the cost of the delayed contract scheduled for every day of delay until such goods/services are finally delivered and accepted by the procuring entity concerned. In no case shall the sum of the liquidated damages exceed 10% of the total contract price, in which the procuring entity concerned may rescind the contract and impose appropriate sanctions over and above the liquidated damages.
